

David "Taff" Ross

Ross, Pvt. David "Taff" -Killed 6 Nov. 1778 on journey from Ft. McIntosh to Fort Laurens

"In moving on, Lieut. Parks of Gibson's regiment, and David Ross, a spy a spy (a former prisoner with the Indians) generally called by his Dutch friends Taff Ross--Ross ahead as spy, and Parks out near him trying to kill a deer, were both killed by Indians, who fled away."
